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



She talked me into volunteering for the elementary school's fall festival and from there I used my love of both art and bringing happiness through face painting to help at the walks."



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This year marked a complete return to in-person live events rather than virtual ones. HFGF funds were used to provide the following services to the bleeding disorders community during the year:

Camp Spirit - \$25,000 was spent to send 22 campers to Camp Boggy Creek for a week.

Family Retreat Weekend - \$5,000 provided a family weekend for 100 people with bleeding disorders.

Medic Alerts and Comfy Caps - \$20,000 provided 500 new and renewal medic alert subscriptions and 25 Comfy Caps for infants with bleeding disorders.

Emergency Financial Assistance - \$55,000 was used to give families with bleeding disorders emergency help with basic costs such as housing, bills, insurance coverage, medical and dental appointments, and gift (food assistance) and transportation cards.

Scholarships - \$24,000 was provided to Florida residents with bleeding disorders to help with costs of college, university, or trade school education.

A very important part of the HFGF's mission is to educate the bleeding disorders community and the broader community about bleeding disorders and to support the work of the Hemophilia Treatment Centers (HTCs). To fulfill that portion of its mission, the HFGF pays for and presents educational programs in settings all around the state including Jacksonville, Gainesville, Orlando, Tampa-St. Petersburg, and Miami. More than \$80,000 was spent on educational programs on topics ranging from bleeding disorders trivia games, self-care, believing in yourself, physical therapy, teen and young adult programs, and women and bleeding disorders including the distribution of more than 250 Fem Care kits.
